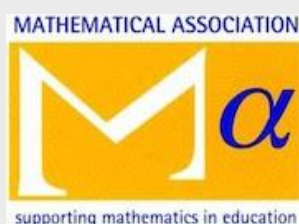

The event will provide a forum for practitioner researchers to share their projects with a focus on broadening research skills to support systematic approaches. The day is organised by BERA Special Interest Groups on Mathematics Education, in collaboration with BSRLM.
